We thank you for your patience, as it was not an easy task to ensure that the funds went through to the right people and was spent on rebuilding. However your patience has paid off and in her recent visit to Nepal, Rinpoche met with the supporters and elderly nuns of this precious hermitage and they all were very pleased to report and show photos of some of the progress.

Now 70 retreat rooms are under construction. This time all the huts are going to be earthquake-proof and environment-friendly. Here are some images to share. At present many of them are living in a temporary tin-roof hall in the city near the Tibetan settlement. Younger nuns are at the site helping with the construction. It has been a difficult year for these nuns and the dharma has been their ever-shining light. They expressed their gratitude to each of you to offer your hard earned funds.

They will keep you in their heart and prayers. They send you blessings from the remote Himalayan Mountains on the border of Nepal and Tibet!

In future I am invited to visit the nunnery and we can make a plan to visit Nepal. This is the very place where I did my retreat and practice with our late Guru Sengdrak Rinpoche, 20 years ago. This recent visit was a reminder of impermanence - my favourite teaching! Even though outer circumstances have been shaky, the light of the inner teachings are alive in each of the nuns and the sponsors. Also Sengdrak Rinpoche's incarnation is a brilliant young child.

With everyone's collective support, once again this place will blossom. Every single dollar will go to a virtuous cause. So join us in this noble endeavour.
